# CHAPTER 1: DISCOVERING THE SEXUAL REVOLUTION, WHERE IT ALL BEGAN

1. EARLY PSYCHOANALYTIC THEORIES: SIGMUND FREUD'S WORKS IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY HIGHLIGHTED THE ROLE OF HUMAN SEXUALITY IN SHAPING IDENTITY, ENCOURAGING DISCUSSIONS AROUND REPRESSED DESIRES.

- 2. BIRTH CONTROL: THE INVENTION OF THE BIRTH CONTROL PILL IN 1960 BY DR. GREGORY PINCUS AND DR. JOHN ROCK REVOLUTIONIZED REPRODUCTIVE AUTONOMY, GRANTING WOMEN UNPRECEDENTED CONTROL OVER THEIR BODIES

## **CHAPTER 2: KEY PROTESTS AND DEMONSTRATIONS**

#### 1. THE STONEWALL RIOTS (1969)

WHERE: NEW YORK CITY, USA

WHAT HAPPENED: POLICE RAIDED THE STONEWALL
INN, A GAY BAR, LEADING TO VIOLENT CLASHES
BETWEEN LAW ENFORCEMENT AND THE LGBTQ+
COMMUNITY. THE RIOTS BECAME A CATALYST FOR
THE MODERN LGBTO+ RIGHTS MOVEMENT.

TIMELINE NOTE: JUNE 28, 1969 — THE FIRST NIGHT OF THE STONEWALL RIOTS.

#### 2. MISS AMERICA PROTEST (1968)

- WHERE: ATLANTIC CITY, USA
- WHAT HAPPENED: FEMINIST ACTIVISTS
   PROTESTED AGAINST THE OBJECTIFICATION OF WOMEN BY PICKETING THE MISS AMERICA BEAUTY PAGEANT, SYMBOLIZING THEIR REJECTION OF RESTRICTIVE GENDER NORMS.

TIMELINE NOTE: SEPTEMBER 7, 1968 — PROTESTERS THROW SYMBOLIC OBJECTS LIKE BRAS AND GIRDLES INTO A "FREEDOM TRASH CAN."

#### 3. UK WOMEN'S LIBERATION MARCH (1971)

- WHAT HAPPENED: THOUSANDS OF WOMEN MARCHED THROUGH LONDON DEMANDING EQUAL PAY, FREE CONTRACEPTION, AND ACCESS TO CHILDCARE, MARKING A SIGNIFICANT MOMENT IN BRITAIN'S FEMINIST MOVEMENT.

TIMELINE NOTE: MARCH 6, 1971 — WOMEN'S LIBERATION MARCH IN LONDON.

# C<u>hapter 3: Significant figures of the</u> <u>Movement</u>

#### 1. MARGARET SANGER (USA)

- ROLE: PIONEER OF BIRTH CONTROL AND FOUNDER OF PLANNED PARENTHOOD.
- IMPACT: ADVOCATED FOR REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS
  AND ACCESS TO CONTRACEPTION, LAYING THE
  GROUNDWORK FOR SEXUAL FREEDOM.

#### 2. ALFRED KINSEY (USA)

- ROLE: RESEARCHER AND AUTHOR OF THE KINSEY REPORTS.
- IMPACT: CHALLENGED SOCIETAL NORMS BY PUBLISHING DATA ON SEXUAL BEHAVIORS, NORMALIZEING DISCUSSIONS ABOUT SEX.
